The death and resurrection of Jesus Christ are at the heart of the gospel, and Good Friday and Easter are two of the most significant celebrations of the year. Lent is a season of preparation and repentance during which we anticipate Good Friday and Easter. Just as we carefully prepare for big events in our personal lives, such as a wedding or graduation, Lent invites us to make us ready for remembering Jesus' death and celebrating Jesus' resurrection. The practice of a forty-day preparation period began in the Church during the third and fourth centuries. The number forty carries biblical significance based on the forty years Israel spent in the wilderness and Jesus' forty-day fast in the wilderness. The forty days of Lent begin on Ash Wednesday and continue through holy week, not counting Sundays (which are alway days of feasting, celebrating in worship.)

Text: Luke 19:28-38

Title: The Entrance of the King Speaker: Dave O'Connell

After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ²⁹ As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, ³⁰ "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here ³¹ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it.""

- ³² Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. 33 As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?"

For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed..., but with the precious blood of Christ.


