Repentance is not usually a moment wrought in high drama. It is the steady drumbeat of a life in Christ and, therefore, a day in Christ. —Tish Harrison Warren

I learned the first rule of repentance: that repentance requires greater intimacy with God than with our sin. How much greater? About the size of a mustard seed. Repentance requires that we draw near to Jesus, no matter what. And sometimes we have to crawl there on our hands and knees Repentance is an intimate affair. And for many of us, intimacy with anything is a terrifying prospect. — Rosario Champagne Butterfield

Repentance leads to despair if you don't understand the gospel. Repentance leads to joy and love and a burst of energy and growth if you do, because repentance leads to a greater appreciation and gratitude and thrill at what Jesus has done for us. This is the dynamic—as that's moving along, you grow. That how you grow. If my sin leads me to despair, on what basis do I believe God loves me? Is it my effort? My moral excellence? Is it coming up to my standards? If so, of course repentance is going to push me down. But if Jesus is my Savior, then repentance is the beginning of the cycle—it gets the combustion cycle going. — Tim Keller

When you see what effect sin has on the loving God who died so you wouldn't do it, who died for your holiness...When you begin to see that it melts you, and it makes you begin to hate the sin. It begins to lose it's attractive power over you. Instead of making you hate yourself, you find you hate the sin, so the idol begins to get crushed bit by bit. — Stephen Charnock
